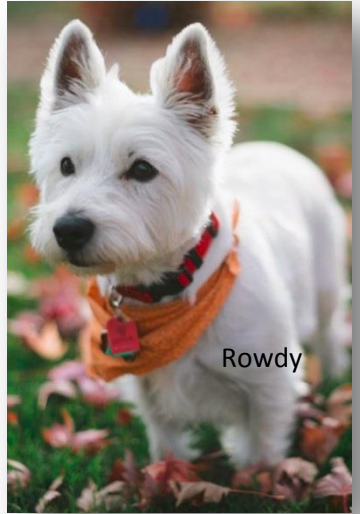
But Fate Intervened . . .

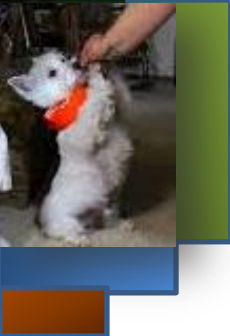

St. Pat's Easy Westie Drop Cookie Recipe

I love making these dogs treats for my little Westies and I hope you will too! These Carrot, Cheese and Spinach treats are perfect as a drop cookie or you can shape them into little puppy bones.

Recipe:

2 and 3/4 cup whole wheat flour (or gluten free baking mix)
1 cup shredded carrots
1 cup fresh spinach
1 cup shredded cheddar cheese
2 cup bran cereal, crushed (do NOT use Raisin Bran)
2 tablespoons olive oil or melted coconut oil
2 teaspoons baking powder
1 - 1/2 cup water



Preheat oven to 350 degrees and grease your baking sheets.

Place spinach in a food processor with a little water and pulverize into a spinach paste. Mix spinach, carrots, cheese and oil in a large bowl; in a smaller bowl, mix dry ingredients. Add the dry ingredients to the spinach-carrot-cheese-oil mixture then add water, mix well.

Drop cookies onto cookie sheet and bake for 25 minutes until browned. Cool and store.
